The Chrysanthemum — a symbolic flower of autumn — was allegedly brought to Japan from China around the 8th century, since which time the plant has been loved and cultivated by the Japanese people. Chrysanthemum enthusiasts groom and train the flowers in various forms as sophisticated artworks.

The Hiroshima Castle Chrysanthemum Exhibition showcases a special large-scaled floral decoration as well as around 2,000 chrysanthemum flowers in pots attentively grown by enthusiasts in Hiroshima.
